Development of Comprehensive Literacy Programs at All Levels



About

- At the beginning of 2015, there were 1.986 million people in Latvia – less than 2 million for the first time!
 We have twice as many retired persons as we have children.
- The 298 thousand people under 14 are the presumed common focus cohort for librarians and the education sector.
- In 2012, Latvian students scored somewhat under the OECD average, and only 2.9% of students aged 15 were very good readers.

Book Start

 Reading promotion program "Book Start" is implemented since 2014 and it is a sequel of 2007 Children's Literature Centre project "The first meeting with the

and later in school years to have access to different reading materials





The goals of the program:

- To promote the joy of reading for children and teenagers and in families;
- To establish a reading promotion network in Latvia and in Latvian centers abroad;
- To spread children and young adult own thoughts about the books that are written for them;
- To promote the distribution of good literature;
- 80 to 100 thousand euro from state are invested annually to promote reading among various age groups.

42 Latvian diaspora centres in 15 countries across Europe, the US, Canada, and Australia



How it works

- Children and Young adult have to read 5-7 books from the years collection and have to fill in a questionnaire about the most interesting one
- The little gift for everyone, who reads books and fill a questionnaire
- Final In Big Reading Celebration in March everyone can find out TOP 3 of best books

Number of Parents Jury participants

- 2012 1324 (15 of them was men)
- 2013 1424 (70 of them was men)
- 2014 1817 (134 of them was men)



- Reading promotion is a long-term investment and it needs continuous improvement to make sure the positive trends are permanent and every year needs to have something new on offer
- This program provides not only increase of library clients but also increase of reading competence
- So far in Latvia any attention hasn't been paid to the biggest risk groups with reading difficultiessuch as boys or children from disadvantageous families. Innovations have to be made in these particular reading segments but every one of them demands different methods and extra funding as well as support from community
