Author of the idea to create an association for the librarians in Estonia was **Aleksander Sibul**

I Estonian librarians congress 24.-25.02 1923

I ELA Statute prepared 1922

Goals of the Association in the first Statutes:

- promotion of librarianship
- development of vocational education for librarians
- the protection of vocational interests of librarians

I Congress 1923: development needs for the library field

Resolutions:

- Libraries should be equal with schools
- Need to consolidate and diversify the library network
- Need to regulate the books acquisition subsidy
- Need to establish professional education for librarians
- Need to establish wage system for librarians

ELA 1923-1940: the Association could only function for 17 years

ELA started practically from zero

- No university degree in librarianship offered in Estonia
- No state network of libraries existed
- Libraries did not have their own buildings or rooms or financing
- Almost all librarians worked without salary

ELA prepared the Libraries Act for the Parliament (in force 1.01.1925)

- Estonian Ministry of Education created a position for an advisor who addressed the problems in libraries
- In 1923 the association started publishing their own journal called *Raamatukogu*
- In 1924 1st courses for librarians (all together 49, more than 1000 people)

In 1940 all the associations and societies were prohibited by Soviet Union

V congress of the Estonian librarians 9.06.1988 - Re-establishment of the association

Working group prepared a call for action and published it in national newspapers

Professional association should:

- raise the problems and find the solutions
- broaden librarians' horizon, including international cooperation
- act as an advisor on professional/ vocational education
- offer continuing education on librarianship
- empower librarians as experts on librarianship

Mission: We are acting on behalf of the common interests of librarians, we value libraries and our profession and support lifelong learning and reading culture in Estonia.






